

Review of the FY 2017 Tuition Proposal with Student Leadership

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Tuition Proposal – Undergraduate

- **Undergraduate Resident**
 - No increase to the base: \$5,292/semester, \$10,584/year.
 - Guaranteed for four years
- **UG Differential Increase: *College of Business***
 - +\$90, for a total of \$1,175/semester.
 - UIC agreed last year to smooth the increase over 3 years.
 - Supports 2 student-focused, high impact skill centers: the Business Career Center and Business Learning Center.
 - The comparable cost is still favorable in comparison to local peer institutions.
 - Business students are generally supportive of this increase.

Tuition Proposal – Undergraduate

Non-resident – 3 different rates are proposed:

- ***Non-resident*** (United States residents) – No change to current rate of \$11,720/semester, \$23,440/year.
- ***International*** – \$1,000 higher than the US domestic non-resident rate, or \$12,220/semester, \$24,440/year.
- ***UIC Grant rate*** – 50% higher than the Illinois resident rate, will be made available to US residents that meet minimum academic or skill qualifications, equivalent to a rate of \$7,938/semester, or \$15,876/year.

Tuition Proposal - Graduate

- **Graduate – No increase to base rates for either resident or non-resident tuition**
 - Range 1 (12 hrs and over)
 - In State \$5,740/semester. \$11,480/year
 - Out of State \$11,860/semester, \$23,720/year

- **Graduate Differentials – 1 new and 4 increases to current differential tuition rates**
 - *Medicine (new) – MS in Medical Physiology*: \$5,000/semester, \$10,000/year; total program cost \$21,480/year.
 - New degree program to prepare prospective medical students to reapply for admission after a failed attempt.
 - 2 competing regional programs that charge twice as much.

Graduate Differential Increases

- **Applied Health Sciences *MS in Biomedical Visualization:***
 - \$78/semester, or \$156/year increase to pay for escalating costs of technology advances integral to the curriculum.
 - Total differential cost of \$3,978/semester, or \$7,956/year.
 - Total annual program cost will be \$19,436.
- **Applied Health Sciences *MS in Occupational Therapy:***
 - \$34/semester, or \$68/year to cover necessary clinical practice-related costs that continue to increase.
 - Total differential cost of \$2,309/semester, or \$4,618/year.
 - Total annual program cost will be \$16,098.

Graduate Differential Increases

- **Engineering *Master of Science*:**
 - \$200/semester, \$400/year
 - Total differential cost of \$2,070/semester, \$4,140/year.
 - Total annual program cost will be \$15,620.
 - 4th year of a 4 year phased-in approach to cover associated rising costs of the specialized technical curriculum.
- **Public Health *MS and PhD (except Healthcare Administration)*:**
 - \$185/semester, \$370/year
 - Total differential cost of \$2,050/semester, \$4,100/year.
 - Total annual program cost will be \$15,580.
 - Revenue to enhance curriculum and student services.

Professional Tuition

Increases tied to Higher Education Price Index

- ***Applied Health Physical Therapy***
 - *Resident*: \$484/year, total annual cost of \$16,584
 - *Non-resident*: \$834/year, total annual cost \$28,664
- ***Medicine Medical Doctor (MD)***
 - *Resident*: \$886/year, \$36,328 total annual cost
 - *Non-resident*: \$886/year \$73,328 total annual cost

Professional Tuition

Dentistry:

DMD

- *Resident* – increase of \$950, \$32,730/year
- *Non-resident* – increase of \$1,716, \$58,896/year

Advanced Certificate – increase of \$750, \$25,778/year

DMD Advanced Standing *For Dentists trained outside of the US)*
– increase of \$1,982, \$68,046/year

Clinical Infrastructure Assessment – increase of \$218/year,
\$7,488/year

Summer 2016 Rate Structural Change

- Summer revenues have declined since 2012 when federal Pell grant eligibility was reduced from 18 to 12 semesters.
- Summer term is especially important for juniors and seniors taking specialized upper division coursework required for degree completion.
- Student survey - summer enrollment is price sensitive. Cost of the UIC summer session mentioned as highest concern across all responding groups.
 - Lack of financial aid is the second highest concern.

Summer 2016 Rate Structural Change

- UIC will reduce tuition for undergraduate courses during the summer similar to what UIUC did in 2013.
 - UIC will no longer charge banded tuition - prices will be on a per credit hour basis.
 - Fees will be reduced proportionally.
- Graduate and Professional Summer tuition will remain in the range tuition and fee structure.
